## Message

### The Audacity of Hope



Youth is almost synonymous with energy, they react, they revolt, they dare, they dream..... life is beautiful. Precisely so, it is also full of promise, the promise of a future, of dreams coming true, of making a difference.

What is the key for such a promise or a dream? The old saying goes, that the road to heaven is lined with people who had beautiful intentions but have remained stranded while others walked to the end of the line. What makes some people persistent winners while others are perennial losers ... is there a pattern to that regularity?

The answer perhaps in the "audacity of hope". Hope is a combination of various elements that drive and motivate people. Hope arises when people have a clear vision of their objective, of what they want to achieve-Clarity. Clarity however is not only about knowing, it is about knowing clearly, about understanding the objective in depth, including the means that are required to achieve the objective and the endurance that may be

demanded for the same. Without knowing the objective in its entirety, there is no clarity. And above all, clarity requires a clear intellectual understanding – it is driven by the mind, and not by the heart.

Such a clarity synchronizes all the abilities of the person towards that goal in a manner that one is energized to achieve it. Energy is not a bull in the china shop – it is the stamina to stand one's intellectual ground (including refining it when one must), the endurance to hold during a bad patch (including temporary setbacks and opposition) and the persistence both in the mind as well as in the body.

The discourse that is prevailing now, all over, including in the Schools and Universities boils down to this – either clarity is missing (wrong perception, therefore wrong understanding and lack of clarity), or courage and perseverance are missing or both. Even the use or the misuse of freedom which is the humankind's most precious gift, can fall prey to this short circuit of reasoning and action.

Freedom and debate are essential, and without them life would be dull and devoid of joy. But both freedom and debate have to be based on reason. Defiance too has to have clarity, defiance too requires legitimacy. In South America many people, including religious men and women took arms against oppressive regime, died in battles or were killed by the state in cold blood. That was their choice, but was a legitimate choice. Shouting slogans against your country must be a rational choice, must be legitimized with the clarity of one's objectives whose elements must be tried and tested, otherwise it is a cynicism. All such acts of cynicism are not necessarily signs of adherence to those slogans, but they are signs of bad reasoning, deficient discourse and often the release of unbridled energy. When you write about some aspects of the Hitler's actions that directly or indirectly have nothing to do with Nazi policies, you do not become a Nazi, nor when you write about some of the things that British did in India, you do not become anti-national.

Such cynicism is rampant in other ways too, when people are obsessed with Facebook or Phone for whatever reason, if it be, social networking. It is the lack of clarity, it is the failure of reasoning and it is the lack of legitimacy.

When you believe in something you need the courage to pursue that goal – you need clarity, endurance and endless energy. And the one all important part of this belief-action-pursuit is the courage to make the difference. President Obama coined that beautiful idea of "audacity of hope".

Hope is the ultimate tonic that drives you. Cynicism is a choice, but **Hope is a better Choice.**

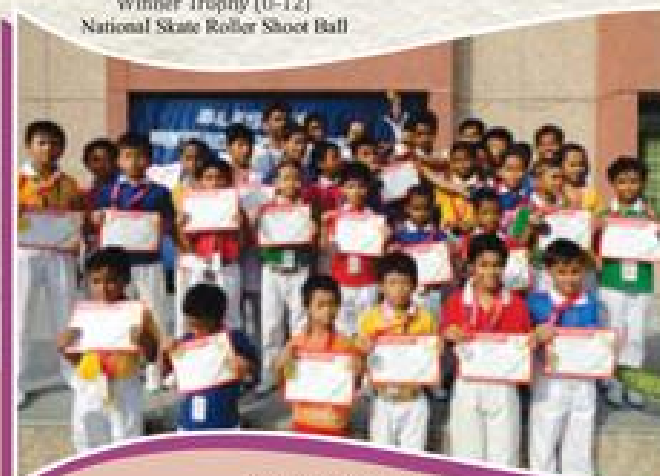

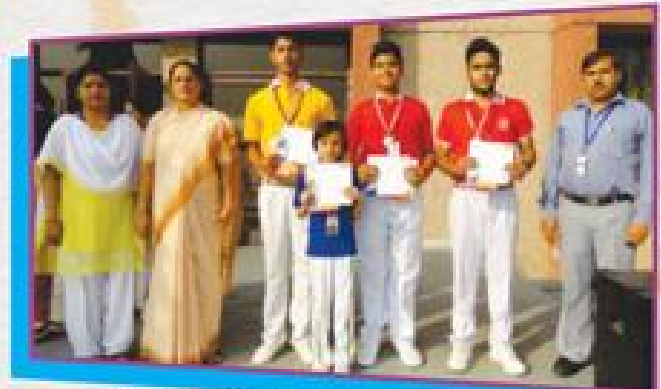

### Green School Programme

Fr. Agnel School, Greater Noida is enrolled in 'Green Schools Programme', commenced by CSE (Centre of Science and Environment) for the last three years. ## Matters of Concern

### Handling with Adolescence

According to Erik H. Erikson, an American psychologist, 'The adolescent is like a trapeze artist experiencing a vigorous motion between two landings – childhood and adulthood. He must let go off his hold on childhood and reach out for the unknown adulthood.'

To solve the unwanted and unwelcome questions posed by the adolescents the workshops were organized by the School in three groups – 1. Boys of classes VIII-IX, 2. Girls of VIII-IX and group 3 of classes X-XII. In the workshops they were explained that hormonal changes bring about abrupt mood changes and intellectual growth gives them new insights into cognitive issues. They were advised to confide with their parents and teachers to get their answers. A workshop for teachers was also conducted on the issues related to adolescents. It is commendable that such initiatives are taken by the Principal and Management for the good of the children.

### Street Play

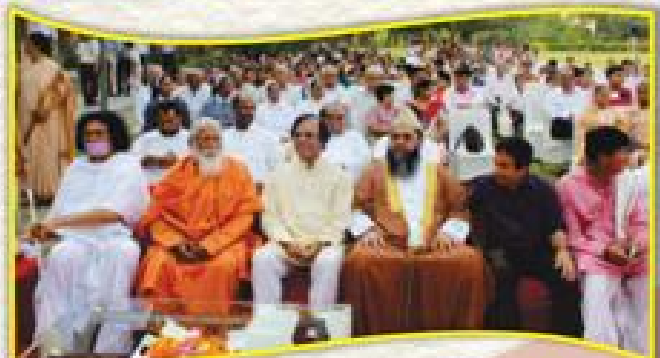

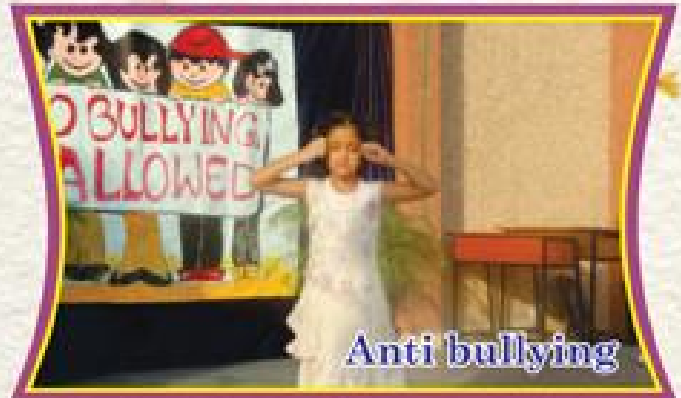

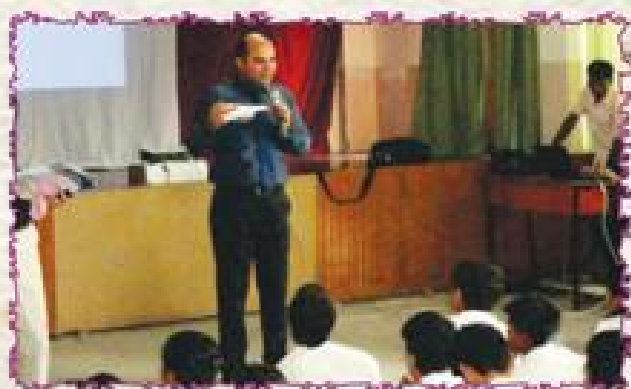


## Programmes for Students' Development

**Fashion Designer** – Fashion designers use area, perimeter and diameter as well as Mathematical algorithms to help create designs and calculate the amount and cost of fabric required.

**Astronaut** – Astronauts use Maths to make precise Mathematical calculations, from how the spacecraft leaves Earth's atmosphere to how the astronauts pilot the craft.

**Architect** – Architects use Maths to calculate the square footage of rooms and buildings, to lay out floor space dimensions and to calculate the required space for other areas such as parking, plumbing, etc.

As we have seen, Mathematics play a vital role in our lives. It is almost impossible to get through a day without using Maths. One thing is sure, our world and daily activities are replete with numbers. Students must therefore, take the Mathematics seriously as the subject is essential and practical. It will prove to be useful tool in many important activities.

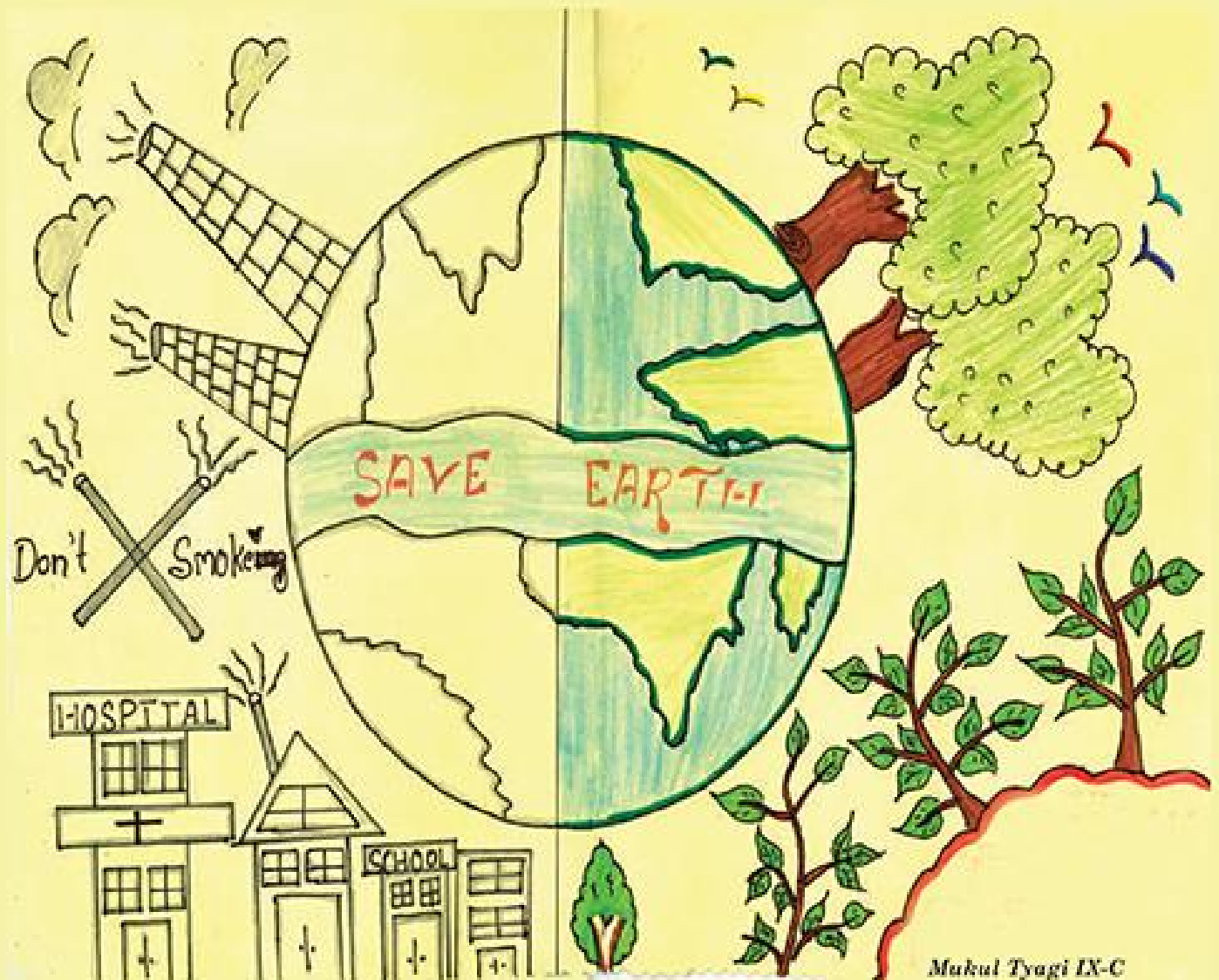
## WOW Moments at Worlds of Wonder
